

Dear parent,

Your support for your child's education is crucial to their progress. If your child has a disability, it is even more important that we work together so they can achieve their best, but to do this requires the school to know about the child's disability.

The school has a duty under the Equality Act (2010) to make "reasonable adjustments" for disabled children. In order to make these adjustments, some information regarding your child's disability may have to be disclosed to certain members of staff in the school.

Detailed information about the nature of your child's impairments or medical information will not be passed on unless it is relevant to making reasonable adjustments. You can request that no information is passed on to others, or you can request that information is restricted to certain people. However, you should be aware that if you do this it could limit the types of adjustments the school can make for your child.
